## Hayes High School Senior Named Bill Gates Millennium Scholar



Congratulations to **Ivan Jones**, trombonist in the **Hayes Mighty Marching Pacesetters**, for being named a **Bill Gates Millennium Scholar**. The scholarship will pay Ivan's college expenses in-full at any college or university of his choosing through the doctoral level.

The Bill Gates Scholarship, established in 1999, provides outstanding minority students with significant financial need the funding to advance and complete their education. Ivan wrote eight essays, completed a 22 page application and submitted references in order to be considered.

Of the 11,000 students nationwide who applied, 1000 were selected.

BAP is proud that one of Birmingham's students has been selected and is being honored with this award.

Ivan plans to study music education and intends to receive his doctoral degree. He believes that along with his academic successes, his extra-curricular activities and his community service contributed to his selection. Did we mention that he has accumulated over 900 hours of community service? Here is a young man who is being rewarded for his hard work scholastically and for giving back to his community.

When Hayes High School was reopened in 2004, BAP and the Community Foundation of Birmingham purchased band equipment to help start the band program and continues to be a resource for them.

### Earl Bennett

*Former West End High School All-Sports Stand-out Makes an Impact at Vanderbilt University*



Earl Bennett, former West End High School all-sports stand-out, has made a huge impact on the football program at Vanderbilt University. Earl received many awards and accolades while at West End and he is continuing that tradition in college.

He was selected for the 2005 SEC All Freshman First Team and the Freshman All-American Second Team. Even though he was not a full-time starter, Earl set a team and SEC

record for most catches as a freshman with 79 receptions.

In 2006, Earl was voted All-SEC Second Team and had another record breaking year with 82 catches for 1,146 yards. He finished the regular season as the SEC's leading receiver in catches and as the first player in league history to record over 75 receptions in back-to-back years.

Earl is listed third in the 2007 *Sporting News* top 25 college football players.

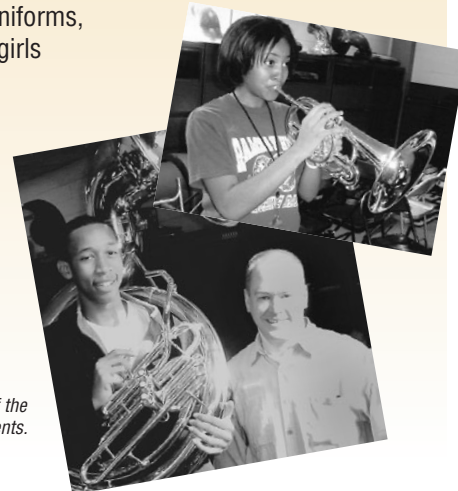
## Since Our Last Newsletter...
